Vestry Briefs-July 20, 2009

The Vestry of Christ Church held its monthly meeting on Monday July 20, 2009. The meeting was called to order at 6:32 pm with Fr, O’Neill offering the opening prayer. All decisions were reached by consensus and unanimous votes. Actions included the following:

Southridge Neighborhood Association Presentation

Mike Hanratty, President, presented his concerns regarding the location of the Epicenter on the Parkway and the people who lingered on in the neighborhood after receiving the food donations. The Vestry listened to the ten minute presentation and assured Mr. Hanratty that “we want to be good neighbors” and would work together toward that goal.

Construction Update

The kitchen renovation is in its final stages of completion. To showcase the kitchen, a Labor Day Barbeque is being planned.

Christ Church Property and Casualty Insurance Update

Effective August 1, 2009, the insurer for Christ Church is the *Church insurance Company of Vermont*. This is an authorized insurance carrier for the Diocese of Nevada. The current carrier, *Guide One Insurance*, is not a Diocesan authorized provider.

Oversight Responsibilities of the Rector

The oversight responsibilities of the Interim Rector will be divided into small committees. Six committees were initially selected and Vestry members will chair the committees. The committees are: Buildings and Grounds, Christian Formation, Finance, Parish Growth, Parish Organizations, and Community Ministries (Outreach).

Our organ will have five divisions and a console that has four manuals.

A manual is a full keyboard. Each manual or keyboard controls one division of the Great Organ. Remember that the organ also has a pedal board, played by the feet.

A rank, sometimes called a stop, is a voice (i.e. flute, trumpet, oboe, strings). Generally speaking, each rank will have 61 pipes.

A division is a grouping of ranks. The divisions of our organ will be the Great, the Swell, the Choir, the Antiphonal, and the Pedal.

Different divisions will be either enclosed or under expression. The term "under expression" means that the casework for that division will have shutters. The organist will control the dynamics by opening and shutting the shutters, controlled by a pedal on the console.

As you sit at the console the first (or bottom) manual will control the Choir division, which is under expression. This division is used to accompany a soloist or a smaller group of singers, like the choir. It can also be used to accompany a solo voice played on the Swell.

The next manual will control the Great division. This is the primary division and will provide the foundation for congregational singing.

The third manual will control the Swell division, which is under expression. This division can also be used for a smaller group of singers but is usually used for a featured voice, like a trumpet or flute. The organist will play the accompaniment on the Great or the Choir manual and add a featured voice from the Swell.

The fourth (or top) manual will control the Antiphonal division. This division will be located in front on the Epistle side and will be "coupled" with the Great division for congregational singing. It can also be used by itself for smaller services, or is also very useful to give pitches, if needed, to the clergy for chanting.

By coupling the Antiphonal to the Great Organ, we should be able to control the acoustic present in our church.
